<u>SCRIPTURE</u> (do not read until prompted in the discussion questions) Isaiah 53:2 | John 7:38 | Colossians 3:1-3

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

• Sometimes when a miracle happens we are surprised and in awe. But since we are favored, chosen, peculiar, royal and chosen miracles should be normal. Your life should be filled with times where God steps in and makes a miracle in your life. Part of our vocabulary should be about the times God steps out shows the world that we are distinct and different. Are miracles normal for you? When was the last time God showed up and showed off?

• Jesus was not raised in a home full of anointing, but in a home of a businessman. God gets great pleasure by going to unexpected places and making greatness. Jesus was not famous but the Bible even says in Isaiah 53:2, "He had no beauty or majesty to attract us to him, nothing in his appearance that we should desire him." The one not invited in the room is the one God wants to use. **Have you** ever felt less than because you weren't invited into a room? Being great doesn't make you better, it makes you different, <u>declare</u> the greatness inside you. Read John 7:38. The King James Version says, "...out of his belly shall flow rivers of living water." The belly is translated into your bowels therefore there is something about a "gut feeling". It is important to listen to that gut feeling because that is where your spirit is coming from. Have you ever ignored your gut feeling? How did that work out?

Bishop TD Jakes said during our 212 conference, "Everything you will be you already are." Everything you can be in your potential is hidden in your anointing. When something inside of you is saying there is more but your head doesn't know what to do frustration builds. Your heart and spirit tells you that you are worth more and can do more but if your head hasn't caught up then you don't know where to go. Have you ever been frustrated? Do you believe you can do more and be more but your head tries to talk you out of it? What is the more you are believing for?

• Read Colossians 3:1-3. Reset your mind on the anointed version of yourself not the broken version. If you are constantly living in the broken then you can never arrive to your anointing. Ask yourself: What if I am anointed to be powerful but I think I am weak? What if I am anointed for wealth but think like a pauper? What if I am anointed for joy but think like a depressed person? You will feel the frustration until you can set your mind to where you're anointed. What do you believe you are anointed for but haven't been able to obtain? What can you start doing today to live the anointed version of yourself?

OUR CHALLENGE

You do not have to create your life; you have to discover it. Your life is planned out for you but you have to find out what God has planned. This week go on a self-discovery of the anointed version of you. Stop living the broken version and live for the anointing that is already in you.
