DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

• There are times that we lose heart because our prayers are not being answered. To lose heart means to grow inwardly weary because of outward circumstances. Since our focus should be on heaven (things unseen) and not on earth (things that are seen), then our circumstances have the ability to change. If there is a situation that continues to make you lose heart, remember: it is subject to change. Did you ever lose heart on an outward circumstance that was not changing? What would you say to your past self to not lose heart?

 It is the job of your enemy to put something in front of you that contradicts the word of God in you. If God says, "I want you to be blessed" yet you see poverty and lack, the enemy is trying to talk you out of your blessing. **Read Galatians** 6:9. It is the time between seed and harvest that can make you weary. When Peter walked on water, he was actually walking on the word. He started sinking when he lost his focus. Your focus will determine if you will keep walking or start sinking. Has God ever told you something yet it contradicted what was in front of you?

- The kingdom doesn't have church members; it has citizens. When we are born again we become citizens of the kingdom of heaven. And when you pray you are asserting influence in your homeland. In a kingdom, citizens don't fight they go before the judge to try to plea their case to make their situation right. Whenever you have circumstances that contradict what God has said, you have the right to go before the judge and say, "make this right." Are you standing on a bible verse to get you through your circumstances? If not, have the group find verses for those members that need to go before God and remind him to "make it right".
- Whenever you feel sick, go into the courtroom of heaven and demand an eviction of your sickness. Remind God that he didn't purchase sickness; he purchased healing. God didn't purchase poverty; he purchased prosperity. You need to evict the bondages in your life because Jesus purchased freedom and healing through the cross.
 Have you given the enemy an eviction notice? What has the cross-done for you?
