## **OPEN IN PRAYER**

### MAIN SCRIPTURES (read when prompted)

On the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. <sup>2</sup>Now both Jesus and His disciples were invited to the wedding. <sup>3</sup>And when they ran out of wine, the mother of Jesus said to Him, "They have no wine." <sup>4</sup>Jesus said to her, "Woman, what does your concern have to do with Me? My hour has not yet come." <sup>5</sup>His mother said to the servants, "Whatever He says to you, do it." <sup>6</sup>Now there were set there six waterpots of stone, according to the manner of purification of the Jews, containing twenty or thirty gallons apiece. <sup>7</sup>Jesus said to them, "Fill the waterpots with water." And they filled them up to the brim.

#### JOHN 2:1-7 (NKJV)

Then they came to Jericho. As Jesus and his disciples, together with a large crowd, were leaving the city, a blind man, Bartimaeus (which means "son of Timaeus"), was sitting by the roadside begging. <sup>47</sup> When he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to shout, "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!" <sup>48</sup> Many rebuked him and told him to be quiet, but he shouted all the more, "Son of David, have mercy on me!" <sup>49</sup> Jesus stopped and said, "Call him." So they called to the blind man, "Cheer up! On your feet! He's calling you." <sup>50</sup> Throwing his cloak aside, he jumped to his feet and came to Jesus. <sup>51</sup> "What do you want me to do for you?" Jesus asked him. The blind man said, "Rabbi, I want to see." <sup>52</sup> "Go," said Jesus, "your faith has healed you." Immediately he received his sight and followed Jesus along the road.

# LET'S TALK ABOUT IT!

- God is in control of the seasons in your life. Resisting the changes of a new season is tough. When God brings a change in your life he will make you adapt. Instead of fighting the changes, roll with them. Don't be afraid to go into the next season because God is always able to exceed himself and can do greater in the new thing than the last thing. Are you prepared for the new season you have been praying for?
- Read John 2:1-7. Sometimes you need someone to push you into your next season. Even though Jesus was 30 years old, he was comfortable with his current season. But his mother, the authority in his life at the time, knew that there was more in him. She put a demand in his life and made him uncomfortable. Sometimes you will know that a new season is approaching because a demand will be put on your life. Who would be the person to push you into your next season? Have you ever been not ready to go into a new season?
- Read Mark 10: 46-52. Sometimes you will look foolish going into your new season. Blind Bartimaeus knew that his chance with Jesus was going to pass him up if he didn't do something in that moment. When your moment comes, know what you want. God supplies specific moments with specific people in your life so doors can be opened. Blind Bartimaeus knew it was his time even if those around him were trying to shut him down. But he got louder and crazier to make sure he didn't let his new season pass him by. Open the bible and read 1 Corinthians 1:27. If Jesus were walking by you, how would you get his attention? And what would you ask of him?

### PRAYER FOCUS

This week think about what you want from God. He is constantly opening doors and providing opportunities, but do we know what we want? Pray about what you truly want from God and don't be afraid to be honest and open with your Lord!
