MESSAGE SUMMARY | It's All Yours, Pastor Duaine Johnson

This week, we learned that everything God has promised is *already ours* through Christ. We are not fighting for victory - we're living from it. What God wrote about us before we were born has already been settled in heaven, and the enemy cannot take what has been secured by the blood of Jesus.

Many believers live as if they're waiting on God to release what He's already made available. But through fellowship with the Holy Spirit, we gain access to everything Jesus purchased - peace, authority, purpose, and power. The key is alignment: walking by faith, staying in relationship with the Holy Spirit, and claiming what is already written in our favor.

When you live from victory instead of striving for it, you begin to see God's promises activated in your everyday life.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Living From Victory, Not For It

Key Scripture: (1 Corinthians 3:21–23), (Romans 8:16–17), (John 10:10)

Main Points:

- Everything God has belongs to His children "all things are yours."
- Victory was accomplished at the cross; you are walking in finished work.
- Faith isn't begging God to move it's believing He already has.
- The enemy only holds what you haven't claimed by faith.
- Living from victory brings peace and confidence in every circumstance.

Reflection Questions:

- What does "living from victory" mean to you personally?
- Are there areas where you've been waiting for God to do what He's already promised?
- How would your daily outlook change if you truly believed everything you need is already yours?

Accessing What's Already Yours

Key Scripture: (Luke 10:19–20), (Revelation 5:9–10)

Main Points:

- You have authority through Christ to walk in dominion and freedom.
- The Holy Spirit reveals and activates what Jesus purchased.
- Fellowship with the Spirit is how we access divine promises.
- You don't earn your inheritance you receive it by faith and relationship.
- You were redeemed to rule and reign with Christ, not to live defeated.

Reflection Questions:

- How can you stay in closer fellowship with the Holy Spirit this week?
- What does "walking in your inheritance" look like in your current season?
- What truth or promise do you need to begin declaring as already yours?

Faith That Claims What's Written

Key Scripture: (Psalm 139:13–17), (Habakkuk 2:2–3)

Main Points:

- God wrote your story before you lived a single day of it.
- What's written in heaven becomes real on earth when you speak and act in faith.
- The enemy's goal is to keep you unaware or doubtful of what's written about you.
- Faith gives voice to what's already been decreed.
- You live out the pages God has already authored for your life.

Reflection Questions:

- What has God "written" about you that you haven't yet walked in?
- What holds you back from declaring and stepping into those promises?
- How can you remind yourself daily that your story is already established in God's plan?

CONCLUSION & CHALLENGE

Everything you need for life and godliness is already yours in Christ (2 Peter 1:3). You don't have to strive to earn God's promises - you simply align your faith, renew your mind, and stay in step with the Holy Spirit. When you live with that awareness, your prayers shift from "Lord, please do it" to "Lord, thank You that it's already done."

Your inheritance is not waiting to be created - it's waiting to be claimed.

This Week's Challenge

- **1. Identify one promise** in God's Word that applies to your current situation.
- 2. Declare it daily speak it as something already yours, not something you're still waiting for.
- 3. Act in faith take one step this week that aligns your behavior with that promise.
- **4. Encourage someone else** by reminding them that their victory is already secured in Christ.

Memory Verse:

"For all things are yours, and you are Christ's, and Christ is God's."

(1 Corinthians 3:21, 23)

Prayer Focus:

Ask the Holy Spirit to help you live with confidence in what Christ has already finished. Pray for revelation of your inheritance and the courage to walk boldly in what's already yours.
